2012 Class Achieves Best Ever Results for MSB

Five Students in the All-Round Achievers List

The Board of Studies All-Round Achievers List acknowledges students who achieved a mark of 90 or more in ten of their HSC units, including English.

These students will receive the NSW Premier's Award for all-round excellence.











ATAR Results

- Top ATAR of 99.50 [Samantha Camilleri] followed by 98.20 [Antonia Chacon] and 97.65 [Francesca Alexandra]
- 37 % of the eligible cohort achieved an ATAR of over 90 i.e. one in three students who sat the HSC and were eligible for an ATAR
- 67 % of students received an ATAR over 80, i.e. two in three students who sat the HSC and were eligible for an ATAR
- 87% of students received an ATAR over 70.

Nominations for CALLBACK

The entire HSC Dance class was individually nominated to appear as part of the NSW Board of Studies prestigious program *Callback*. The students were Madeleine Silsby, Jessika Fisher and Alicia Gardoni.

Alicia and Madeleine achieved a Band 6, which is an exceptional result.



Other outstanding results

- MSB's History Faculty again performed at an outstanding level with:
 - Ancient History almost 15% above the State mean,
 - Society and Culture almost 11% above the State mean and
 - Modern History 10% above the State mean
- In PDHPE, the combined Bands 5 and 6 compared to the State's aggregate was 47% higher and in Community and Family Studies the combined Band 5 and 6 results were 42% higher than the State's mean
- In Advanced English, 25% of the cohort received a Band 6, compared to just 12% of NSW students, and a further 63% of students achieved a Band 5 compared to 41% of NSW students
- In Studies of Religion 1, almost 30% of students achieved a Band 6 which was almost three times the result achieved by NSW students
- 63% of MSB Physics students achieved a Band 5 or 6 compared to 34% of NSW students 29% higher. Similarly in Senior Science and Biology, MSB's aggregate Band 5 and 6 results were 35% and 20% respectively higher than the State aggregate
- 66% of MSB students studying General Mathematics achieved a Band 5 or 6 compared to just 32% of all NSW students
- Three out of four Information Processes and Technology students received a Band 6
- An extraordinary 95% of MSB students who took Legal Studies achieved a Band 5 or 6 compared to 40% of NSW students.
